REFUGEE SUPPORT AND UKRAINE: WHATS ON IN BRENT AND LOCALLY

More than two million people have fled their homes to escape the conflict in Ukraine. Heavy fighting, shelling and air strikes across the country have had devastating consequences for ordinary people. Homes have been destroyed. Families have been separated. Lives have been lost. At Ukraine's borders with Poland, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Moldova, huge numbers of people are arriving with only what they can carry. The Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC), (which brings together 15 leading UK aid charities to raise funds quickly and efficiently), has launched a **Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal**. DEC charities and their local partners are in Ukraine and in neighbouring countries providing food, water, shelter and medical assistance; see: www.dec.org.uk/appeal/ukraine-humanitarian-appeal. 'Flee' tells the extraordinary true story of Amin, an Afghan refugee now based in Denmark as, on the verge of marriage, he shares for the first time the painful story of his youth, in which he fled war-torn Kabul, desperately sought a safe country in which to live, and gradually came to terms with his sexuality; a story tenderly depicted in artfully blended animation, with archive footage deftly illustrating the historical contexts of the times.
